Coach Outing - Beale Country Park, Reading

In case you've been out of town or a guest at Her Majesty's pleasure recently, you'll know that August 17th is the date of our annual coach outing. This year we're paying a visit to Beale Park in Reading. A lovely park in a beautiful setting, well worth visiting just for the scenery alone. Guests can spend a day in the park and visit the animal sanctuary or just enjoy a pleasant walk around the park and along the banks of the river Thames. Otherwise, shopping at the 'Oracle'.

The lake varies in shape and depth and holds carp, tench, bream, perch, roach and hybrids. It's most suited to pole and waggler fishing as there appears to be a thick bed of weed carpeting the bottom. Depth varies from swim to swim and averages around 6 feet. We found maggot to be most productive, catching small fish almost continually throughout the day. We recommend that you bring a trolley and will try to load as many on the coach as possible, although 6-8 would suffice. Some of the 'better looking' swims are farthest from the drop off point. All in all, I think this will be a very enjoyable day for everyone. (He says, with usual optimism) As usual the pick up point will be at the 'StationMaster' Car Park, 8 am prompt! We'll be calling into the Tilehurst Legion for a pint and a meal afterwards.
