I drew peg 17 on Margaret's lake, a peg I have won several matches from previously but it wasn't to be on this particular day. My total of 4lb of silvers got nowhere. As usual you needed a big carp to be able to make any kind of impact on the result. Top rod was Charles Holmes with a total 20-5-8, which included a carp of 14-13-8. Second place went to the "carp queen" Julie Taylor with 18-10-0 including a carp of 14-7-0. Swinger, John Treasure, was in the wonga coming third with a total of 14-14-0, including a carp of 9-15-0. The event raised £155 for the RBL charity.

The RBL centenary Poppy Appeal match (Bill Milton Memorial) held on the river Avon from Chequers to Newbridge was once again well attended with 80 anglers making the effort, including myself, Paul Wyatt and Jason Pitman. Brian came along for the beer and usual raffle prizes. There were some crazy weights recorded at the end of the match including a staggering 181-04-0 of quality bream from the Trees section, winning the match convincingly. The same section also threw up a few more big weights to take second and third positions with 98-04-0 and 78-04-0 respectively. Some fine specimen chub were caught along the Crane section with a huge 7lb plus chub and one over 4lb. The match raised around £3000!

### Swanny Swings His Way To Victory At Monkton Park, Chippenham, November 28<sup>th</sup>

Only 7 anglers braved this one, which turned out to be a bit of a grueller. The weather was pleasant enough for most of the day but with the river running cold and Clear it was always going to be difficult. Of the 7 who fished, 3 didn't weigh in, including myself and Paul, and one had only 7oz. It was a tightly fought battle for second place with Alan Maggs weighing 1-12-0 (2<sup>nd</sup>)

and Jason weighing 1-11-0. However, outright winner was the man in the woollen, Kazakstani Milkmaid hat, Ian Swanborough with a very respectable 5-1-0 of prime roach caught from peg 6, on the waggler up in the water. The car parking below the shopping centre was just the ticket with easy access to the river via the path and footbridge.
