

A Happy New River Fishing Season To You All!

So, it's July already and we have had one river match on the Crane and at the time of writing, another one is due on the river at Staverton. Sensational Swanny Does It Again On The River Tone – 12^{th} February 2023

Ian Swanborough has been on top form all season and he showed his prowess once again at our match on the fast stretch of the river Tone. Unfortunately, the expected big bags of chub didn't materialise but many of us did find one or two of them plus the odd trout and grayling. Minnows played a big part in the occasion too \textcircled Ian had several chub for a total of 14-08-0, seeing off his nearest rival, Kev Murch, who managed to coax 10-08-0 to the net. In third place was Ian Brice with a few nice specimens for 6-13-0.

Another Sublime Performance From The Unstoppable Swanny – Crane, 19th February

This match replaced the Staverton match, which was cancelled due to flooding and once again, that man Swanny rose to the occasion. 9 anglers turned up for this one and it was a tough old day to say the least. Most anglers on the lower numbered pegs struggled for bites all day and even the higher numbered pegs were slow to give up their residents. Ian fished caster and maggot on waggler on a peg at the end of the first field to amass a weight of 14-09-0 of mainly chub, more than doubling the weight of second placed, Leigh Wakefield, who finished up with a total of 6-13-0. Leigh was packing up early when he had 3 chub in the last 40 minutes. Kev Murch was third with 4-14-0.

A Critical Bream Or Bust Day On The Avon At The Chequers – 12^{th} March

It was the same 9 old hardy souls that turned out for the last match of the river season and on a river that didn't look very inviting. We had a little delay to proceedings first thing, as we didn't have the right combination to the padlock on the gate. Eventually, after a couple of frantic phone calls, we finally got the right numbers and were able to get access into the field. It was too wet to drive on so we all had a muddy push to contend with. The 'straight' was the place to be but once again the expected bags of bream became more of a pipe dream as very few of them showed up to the party. However, Leigh Wakefield managed to find a few, putting 9-09-0 on the scales for an easy victory on a really tough day. Jason Pitman got lucky with one big specimen weighing in at 5-05-0, which was enough to secure second place. Ian Swanborough must have been out of sorts on the day as he only managed third place with 3-13-0.

Invitee Steals The Show (and the cash) At Ivy House – $14^{\rm th}$ April

With the river season now over it was onto the lakes and the first one of the year was at Ivy House, near Chippenham. As usual we struggled to get a full contingent and had to invite a few outsiders to make up the numbers. It doesn't sit well when an outsider wins the match and takes the cash but that's what it has come to. Top man today was Airsprung angler Steve M, with 79-02-0. Our best effort came from Kev Murch who finished second with 41-10-0, and I managed top silvers with 13-04-0. I don't think we'll be doing this one again.

Local Rod Slips In Late And Steals The Show At The Sedges – 21^{st} May

Once again we needed outsiders to make up the numbers for this match at the Sedges, and once again we lost out to a non-member. Local rod, Paul Homewood got a free day's fishing thanks to Fishery Manager, Jamie Cook's intervention before the draw. He also won the match with 53-15-0. Our best effort came from Jason Pitman who finished up with 44-11-0 for second. Third place also went to an outsider, with Andy Gard taking a share of the spoils. So, that makes 2 matches where we have had to call on non-members to make up the numbers and because of this, it was decided at our AGM to cease booking lakes that have a strict minimum angler limit, In future, matches held during the close season, i.e., during April and May, will be held on waters with no minimum limits. This means we could still have matches on lakes if the no minimum limits apply. Otherwise, we will be looking to canals, where we will not be unaffected

We had a good turnout for the first match of the river fishing season on the Crane, with 14 anglers in attendance. That meant there would be anglers drawn in the third field. As usual, everyone wanted to be drawn on a high numbered peg and for good reason. Pegs 11, 12 and 14 produced the bronze for Jason Pitman, Ian Swanborough and John Treasure, with Jason coming out on top with a nice net of slabs for 34-04-0. Close on his heels was Ian S, who fell just short with 31-07-0 for second place, while john managed a single bream and some bits, including an eel, for third place with 5-01-8. Most anglers on the lower numbers struggled, as there was a noticeable shortage of roach and dace about.

Our next club match will be held on the river at Staverton. This dreamy stretch of river has yet to throw up any big weights for us but who knows... maybe this time? This match is also the Pairs match, where all contestants are paired up for the season in pursuit of the prestigious Pairs Challenge Trophy. Good luck to everyone!

Issues raised at the meeting were attendances, especially at the 2 close season matches in April and May. It was agreed not to hold further competitions on waters that have strict lower limits. Also, our treasurer, Clive Purshouse, warned of impending doom if we didn't raise the cost of membership subscriptions to help counteract further potential financial losses. Consequently, all subs have now been raised by £5.

Swanny Swans Off With The Swag At The Annual Prize-Giving Ceremony

In-form Ian Swanborough had a fishing season to relish as his final points tally hit 55, which was 5 points ahead of his nearest rival, Jason.
