And, yet again John Thompson made a lunge for the pot but slipped into second position with his 6lb-6oz net of "ronnies". The hot and fancied peg was on the outfall, but only produced a

few pounds of small maggot mashing tiddlers.

September 14th - Woolverton

I can only report the facts). This time that canny Johnny Thompson did his homework and put together a well laid plan. And it paid off. His 6lb-2oz catch of chub and roach was enough to take the spoils and the F.Bryant Cup. October 12th - Crane

Del Harvey finished third with 2lb-1oz, followed by steady Eddy Davis with 1lb-14oz.
