## National Legion Pairs Open - Bradford-on-Avon

Kingswood Legion put forward 3 pairs and our best placing was a disappointing 10<sup>th</sup> position. However, there was enough joviality and banter afterwards, especially from the Ellesmere Port lads, to warrant a definite return next year.

### **Ted Brown Trophy – Semington - April 15th**

This match was very memorable for two reasons. The unseasonable scorching hot weather and the amazingly unusual Legion catch returns. Despite heavy boat traffic on the canal, and what seemed like a 'Tour de France' bicycle race combined with a London Marathon on the towpath, this venue 'fished it's socks off'. The fish fed continuously from start to finish and was probably one of the most productive Legion matches I have witnessed in a long time. Although only 7 anglers bothered to wet a line, all were adequately rewarded with a good day's sport, which totalled an incredible 79lb-12oz. Antony Hole put in an admirable performance and claimed the honours with a convincing 24-6-0 net of mainly skimmers. I managed to squeeze into second place with 10-14-0, followed closely by John Thomson with 10-5-0 and Clive Purshouse with 10-0-0. Roll on next April.

# May Trophy - Bromham - May 13th

Known as Burbrook Reservoir, this was a new venue for the Legion, and as such we didn't really know what to expect. In any event, whatever might have been expected was soon washed away by the relentless and torrential rain It was a case of carp or bust and the only way they could be tempted to feed was to present a bait right into their living quarters, situated tight into the margins.
