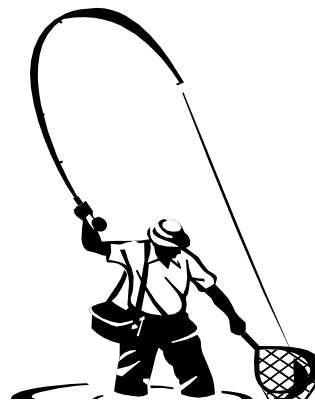


Kingswood Legionnaires
