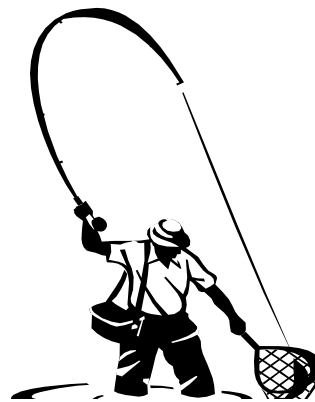

© The next swim clearing sessions prior to the Poppy Appeal Open will be on 2nd/3rd November. If you can make any of these dates, give Brian a ring for more details.

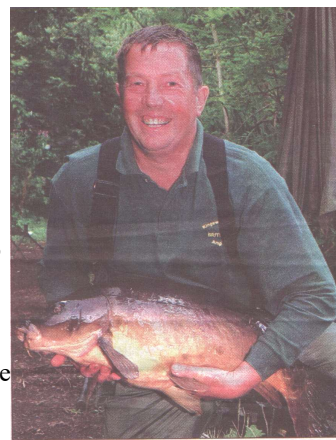
© Branch memberships are due for renewal now. Let Brian have your subs ASAP. Remember! No renewal – no Xmas match – no exceptions!
